One of the biggest problems of Ukrainians is that, unlike our European neighbours, we do not have a habit of smiling unless we are talking to someone or have a reason to do so. This fact can be a bit awkward and confusing for people who are not aware of it. Someone who has just arrived might think that Ukrainians are rude, always disliking something or always sad, but this is not the case. Ukrainians don't often exchange smiles between strangers in public, but if we are talking to friends or acquaintances, we can see sincere emotions that may include a smile.

Ukrainians do not use expressive body language in public. It is bad form to be loud or show a lot of emotion. Furthermore, it is not normally to make physical contact with others unless you have a family or friendship relationship. However, Ukrainians do not avoid standing quite close to each other during conversations.

In addition to the facts mentioned above, Ukrainians also have peculiarities in verbal communication. If we meet someone for the first time, we use the plural or second person form "you" (ви) when addressing older people or people of higher status. It is a polite way of addressing someone. However, if we need to talk to a friend or a person with whom we have an informal relationship, it is better to use the other form – "you" (ти). Therefore, the second

option is rude to use when you meet someone for the first time.

One of the most important distinctions between different cultures is a humor. If you do not know its peculiarities, you may have problems communicating with native speakers.

Now Ukraine is at war, however humor has become a part of our weapon. According to cultural researcher M. Naiem humor serves as a social indicator that distinguishes between one's own group and others. An illustrative instance can be found in contemporary Ukrainian military memes, some of which may only be comprehensible to Ukrainians and could be perceived as inappropriate or taboo by those from other countries. This phenomenon is considered normal, highlighting that humor is heavily influenced by the specific context in which it arises and may be challenging to grasp outside of that context [3].

Besides, humor is always a part of information warfare, and we can see examples of it by looking at history. It can also be used to understand a lot about people, just by knowing what society laughs at and what is the object of its joke culture.

Conclusion. Cultural backgrounds have a great influence on our values and beliefs, which play an important role in human life. They provide a person with the fundamental principles that form their moral compass, which is necessary to guide their behavior and decision-making. The paper presents only a small part of what a person's cultural outlook is and how it affects interpersonal interaction. It is because each nation is special and has its own values that become visible in interaction, and they shape it as something separate. In our opinion, every person should respect both the cultural values of their country and the ethnic and cultural characteristics of other nations.
